





Unprecedented growth in every conceivable way.

2025 marks the 80th anniversary of Central Community Church. I have had the privilege of serving as the Lead Pastor for the past 10 of those years. I praise God for the legacy of faith that came before us and am mindful of the fact that what we give ourselves to now is what our legacy will be in the future.

Simply put, the greatest legacy we can hand down to those who come after us is a robust commitment to gospel-centrality. The gospel is the greatest love story ever told and is the Good News that God sent His Son Jesus to die in our place, pay the penalty for our sins, so that we could be recipients of His grace and be raised to resurrection life with Him (Jn. 3:16; Rom. 6:23; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1 Tim. 1:15 et. al.). Emphasis on the gospel and the implications of the gospel is what makes authentic disciples - creating gospel-people; gospel-culture in lives, families, and our church; developing gospel-shaped leaders; and helping us reach further into the eastern Fraser Valley with the life-transforming news and power of the gospel.

2024 was a year of unprecedented growth in every conceivable way for our church.

- This is our fourth year running our Ministry Internship Program and it is our largest group to date; receiving robust theological and ministry training.
- We now have 15 gifted and qualified elders (2 staff elders and 13 lay elders).
- We now have over 500 individuals sacrificially serving and using their gifts in some capacity, working together to make ministry happen.
- This September our Chilliwack Campus launched a third service (5:15pm) in order to simultaneously create space outside of our overflowing morning services and reach new people who are unable to attend in the morning.
- There is a target date of September 2025 for our Promontory Campus to transition to becoming an autonomous church.

- On Easter Sunday we baptized 7 individuals who responded to Christ's call to believe and be baptized; on August 22nd we baptized another 37; and 14 more during Advent.
- Including those who were baptized, 103 individuals became Ministry Partners this year, committing to what the Lord wants to do in and through us in the eastern Fraser Valley.














Average weekly attendance.




10 years of baptisms.


Committing to what the Lord wants to do in and through us.
